As a student of the pre-diploma or IB Diploma Program at St. Petersburg High School you are expected to maintain the highest standard of academic integrity. Honor means staking one's good name on one's truthfulness, trustworthiness or reliability.

The members of the IB faculty are opposed to cheating for several reasons:

- Cheating allows a student to receive the same or better grade than students who have put in the time and effort to master the material. Dishonestly inflated grades ultimately and unfairly raise the cheater's grade point and class rank, simultaneously lowering the rank of students who study.
- Not only does cheating misrepresent a student's mastery of the subject to parents and colleges, it also distorts the teacher's perception of curriculum effectiveness and class progress.
- The threat of cheating forces the teacher to patrol activities, thus reducing the amount of time he or she has available for productive teaching and course improvement.
- Students who are mature enough to select a difficult and valuable program must also be mature enough to face a low grade when they have earned it.

Every student has the right to pursue an education free from the problems caused by any form of intellectual dishonesty.

I understand that the IB course of study is rigorous, and while group study is both accepted and encouraged, ethical conduct is expected at all times (please see individual teacher/course cheating policies). Academic violation of the Honor Code consists of the following:

- 1. Cheating includes the actual giving or receiving of any unauthorized aid or assistance on any form of any academic work.
- 2. Plagiarism includes the copying of or representation of another's work as one's own.
- 3. Plagiarism also includes claiming as you own work, information from the Internet.
